



Information Form Issued by the Autoklub of the Czech Republic with Regard to Personal Data Processing, Pursuant to Act No 101/2000 on Personal Data Protection

In connection with compliance with the obligations stipulated under Act No 101/2000 on Personal Data Protection and Amendments to Certain Acts (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), the **Autoklub of the Czech Republic** (hereinafter referred to as "the ACCR"), registered office: Opletalova 1337/29, 110 00 Prague 1 - Nové Město, Business Registration No: 00550264, registered in the Register of Associations maintained by Prague Municipal Court (*Městský Soud*), entry: L 1219, **would like to take this opportunity to inform you about the processing of your personal data, your rights, and the rights and obligations of the data controller or data processor(s).**

I. General provisions

1. **The ACCR is a self-governing, voluntary association for those with an interest in motoring, motor sports and the activities of the ACCR.**
2. On the basis of a decision by the FIM (*Fédération Internationale de Motocyclisme* - International Motorcycling Federation) and the FIA (*Fédération Internationale de l'Automobile* - International Automobile Federation), the **ACCR is the exclusive governing authority for motorcycle and motor sport in the Czech Republic** (hereinafter referred to as "the Sports Governing Body"), to the extent set by the FIM and the FIA.
3. **The ACCR's purpose and objects**, including exercising the role as the Sports Governing Body, are defined under Article 2 of the ACCR's Articles of Association. The Articles of Association are published on the ACCR's website at "www.autoklub.cz".

II. Processing the personal data of members of the ACCR and the ACCR's branch associations


1. **Personal data is taken to refer to your address and identification details:** first name(s), surname, date of birth, address (street, village/town/city, postal code), contact details (email address, telephone number) and descriptive data: position/responsibilities. You have provided this personal data by filling in the relevant ACCR form, in particular the ACCR Membership Application Form, the ACCR Club Registration Form and the ACCR Changes to Club Registration Form (hereinafter referred to as "a/the Form"). Provision of this personal data is **voluntary**, but the ACCR requires provision thereof for the registration of a member or a branch association in the ACCR.
2. **The Czech National ID Number in a Form is only required for registration of the individual in question in the Register of Associations** in accordance with Act No 304/2013 on Public Registers of Legal Entities and Natural Persons. The ACCR uses Czech National ID Numbers in accordance with section 13c(b) of Act No 133/2000 on Civil Registration. Provision of a Czech National ID Number is voluntary, but if it is not provided then the individual in question cannot be registered in the register of associations.
3. **The processing of your personal data** will be performed by the data controller (the ACCR) and data processors satisfying the requirements of the Act, in accordance with the Act, **to the extent to which you provided us with such personal data, for the purposes of** administration of the



Body, in the relevant Annual Review of the field of sport in question, on the ACCR's website, which is the ACCR's official information source, and on websites with which the ACCR has a contractual or other legal relationship, even following termination or expiry of the licence. Sensitive data may be provided to the relevant medical committee, designated doctors and other parties, as specified under the IMSRs and/or NMSRs.

11. **Please also note that the provisions of clause II(5),(8),(10) and (11) and of clause III of this Information Form apply to the processing of your personal data.**
